Purpose

The purpose of this enforceable undertaking is to document the undertakings given to SafeWork NSW and accepted by SafeWork NSW pursuant to Part 11 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 (**WHS Act**) in connection with matters relating to alleged contraventions of the WHS Act or the Work Health and Safety Regulations 2011 (**the Regulations**). The Agreed Terms of the Enforceable Undertaking are set out below.

b. Commencement

This Undertaking comes into effect when:

- i. the Undertaking is executed by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd;
- ii. SafeWork NSW accepts the executed Undertaking (Commencement Date).

c. Duration

- i. Section 5 identifies timeframes for the completion of each strategy identified in this enforceable undertaking;
- ii. the enforceable undertaking will be concluded on written advice from SafeWork NSW to Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd when all requirements of the undertaking have been satisfactorily executed.

Section 2 – The alleged contravention

a. Details of the alleged contravention

It is alleged by SafeWork NSW that on 1 February 2021, Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd failed to discharge its obligations as a person conducting a business or undertaking under section 19 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 (NSW) (**WHS Act**) in that it did not ensure so far as reasonably practicable the health and safety of workers who were at work in Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd workplace. It is further alleged that this failure exposed a worker to a risk of death or serious injury contrary to section 32 of the WHS Act.

b. Details of the events surrounding the alleged contravention

On 1 February 2021 at a construction site located at Shellharbour NSW an apprentice who was tasked with installing Dincell formwork wall panels on level 2 of the construction site, stepped onto a piece of plywood. The plywood was covering a penetration. The apprentice fell through the penetration to the basement floor, approximately 12 metres below.

c. The details of any injury that arose from the alleged contravention

d. An acknowledgement that SafeWork NSW alleged a contravention has occurred

It is acknowledged by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd that SafeWork NSW has alleged that Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd has contravened section 32 of the WHS Act.

e. A statement of regret that the incident occurred

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd regrets that the incident on 1 February 2021 occurred and the Worker sustained injuries as a result of the incident.

Note: the above is not an admission of guilt

f. Prior work health and safety convictions

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd has had no prior work health and safety convictions in NSW or any other work health safety jurisdictions.

g. The details of the support provided, and proposed to be provided, to the injured person(s) to overcome the injury/illness

The worker was not employed by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd at the time of the incident.

The following support has been provided to the worker and/or their family:

Brief description of support provided

Shortly after the Incident, Combeda Constructions' Director collected donations on Site from other workers and matched the total of the sum collected, all of which was taken to the injured worker by a colleague so

that the injured worker could purchase various items while in hospital to make their stay as comfortable as possible in the circumstances.

Combeda Constructions' Director confirmed that the injured worker was receiving support from their employer, and that payments were being made through workers compensation and union insurance.

Combeda Constructions' Director sought periodic updates from the injured worker's employer regarding their well-being and the status of their recovery.

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd is committed to complying with its obligations under the WHS Act and ensuring, so far as reasonably practicable, the health and safety of workers and those who may be affected by its business or undertakings.

c. A commitment to the ongoing effective management of work health and safety risks

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd commits that it will, so far as reasonably practicable, maintain ongoing effective management of work health and safety risks.

d. An acknowledgement that the enforceable undertaking will be published and publicised

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that the enforceable undertaking will be published on SafeWork NSW's internet site until the completion of the enforceable terms and may be referenced in SafeWork NSW's publications.

e. A statement of ability to comply with the terms of the enforceable undertaking

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that it has the financial ability to comply with the terms of this enforceable undertaking and has provided evidence with this undertaking to support this declaration.

f. An acknowledgement consultation has occurred within the workplace regarding the proposal of an enforceable undertaking

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that it has consulted within the workplace in relation to the development of the enforceable undertaking proposal, including consultation with all Combeda Construction full time contractors. The consultation occurred on a work site, and the EU process and possible strategies were discussed.

g. Statement regarding relationships with other parties

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd advises that there is an existing relationship held with device identified at Strategy 3 in Section 5 of this enforceable undertaking. was previously engaged by Combeda Constructions as set out in Section 3b of this enforceable undertaking and will benefit as a result of their further engagement as outlined in Strategy 3 in Section 5 of this enforceable undertaking. There is an existing relationship with device the proceedings.

h. Intellectual property licence

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd grants SafeWork NSW a permanent, irrevocable, royalty-free, worldwide, non-exclusive license to use, reproduce, distribute, electronically transmit, electronically distribute, adapt, and modify any materials developed as a result of this enforceable undertaking.

i. A commitment to participate constructively in all compliance monitoring activities of the undertaking

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that the responsibility for demonstrating compliance with this undertaking rests with Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd. Evidence to demonstrate compliance with the terms will be provided to SafeWork NSW by the due date for each Strategy item identified in Section 5.

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that SafeWork NSW may undertake other compliance monitoring activities to verify the evidence that is provided for each Strategy item identified in Section 5. The evidence provided to demonstrate compliance with the undertaking will be retained by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd until advised by SafeWork NSW that the undertaking has been completely discharged.

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that SafeWork NSW may initiate additional compliance monitoring activities, such as inspections, as considered necessary.

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that should there be any delay in the delivery or compliance of the Enforceable Undertaking this will be subject to mutual agreement (confirmed in writing) between Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd and SafeWork NSW.

j. A commitment regarding linking the strategy and promotion of benefits to the enforceable undertaking

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd is committed to ensuring that any real or perceived promotion of a benefit arising from this enforceable undertaking will clearly link the benefit to the enforceable undertaking and that the enforceable undertaking was entered into as a result of the alleged contravention identified in section 2 above.

Where products or other deliverables are externally promoted or have a direct link to the enforceable undertaking Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd will include the following statement:

k. A commitment to gain review and approval for industry and/or community safety information

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd commits that any strategies to be implemented by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd in compliance with this Enforceable Undertaking that involve safety information being provided to the industry and/or community will be subject to SafeWork NSW's review and approval of the content prior to dissemination.

I. Inconsistent Statements

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd commits that it will not make any statement or otherwise imply anything that is inconsistent with the statements, commitments or acknowledgements contained in this Undertaking and will take steps to ensure its representatives, employees and officers do not make any such statements.

m. Reliance on Commitments

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that SafeWork NSW may rely upon the commitments and statements set out in Section 4 (a), (b) and (c) above when making decisions regarding enforcement action if Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd fails to comply with its work health and safety obligations in the future, including but not limited to any failure to comply with its obligations under this Undertaking.

n. Withdrawal or variation

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd may with the written agreement of SafeWork NSW withdraw or vary the undertaking in accordance with section 221 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011.

o. Acknowledgement of Enforceable Undertakings Guidelines and Contravention of the Undertaking

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd has read and understood SafeWork NSW Enforceable Undertakings Guidelines.

Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd acknowledges that if Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd contravenes any of the terms of this Enforceable Undertaking, SafeWork NSW may apply to the District Court for an order in accordance with section 220 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011.

Strategies that will deliver benefits to the workplace, industry and the community

Strategy 3 - Workplace strategy – WHS knowledge and capability building

Summary:

Combeda Constructions will undertake the following activities to increase the level of WHS knowledge and capability within its operations:

- Combeda Constructions will make arrangements for its WHS Officer and the Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer that Combeda Constructions proposes to be engaged (if the person engaged does not already hold the qualification at the time they are engaged) to undertake a course to obtain a certificate IV in work health and safety. Additionally, Combeda Constructions' Director will also undertake training in due diligence under the WHS Act.
- 2. Combeda Constructions will engage a Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer on a full-time basis, who would either already hold a certificate IV in work health and safety or undertake a course to obtain this qualification as detailed above. The person in this role will engage directly with sub-contractors regarding work health and safety issues and compliance, and monitor (and manage where required) sub-contractors working on Combeda Constructions' projects. This role would be in addition to the WHS Officer role, Project Manager and Site Foreperson roles that are already part of Combeda Constructions' operations.
- 3. Combeda Constructions will engage a third party to undertake an audit of Combeda Constructions' WHS compliance and develop a corrective action plan. The scope of the audit will cover all WHS aspects of Combeda Constructions' operations with a particular focus on contractor management. The Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer will then undertake a project of implementing that corrective action plan.
- 4. Combeda Constructions will engage a third party to implement a tailored software package to digitize Combeda Constructions' WHS compliance.

WHS outcome and beneficiaries:

The training in various aspects of work health and safety will provide Combeda Constructions with increased skills and capability in relation to the management of health and safety risks in the workplace and compliance with work health and safety obligations. The employees that complete the training will acquire transferrable skills and knowledge that will be of benefit to workers through the improvements to work health and safety that will come from the acquisition of those skills.

The engagement of a Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer will provide for a higher level of engagement with sub-contractors so that relevant work health and safety issues are managed pro-actively and increased monitoring of sub-contractor compliance. It is also anticipated that the Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer will either have or acquire the increased skills and capability in relation to the management of health and safety risks in the workplace and compliance with work health and safety obligations, will also extend the knowledge transfer to subcontractors through the Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer to the management of health and safety risks in the workplace and compliance with work health and safety obligations, will also extend the knowledge transfer to subcontractors through the Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer dealings with subcontractors through their work related interactions.

Together with the skills acquired through further training of key workers, Combeda Constructions will also seek to improve its WHS compliance strategies through both auditing and developing a corrective action plan as necessary and digitizing Combeda Constructions WHS management systems. The implementation of these changes will be supported by the engagement of a Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer.

Strategy 4 - Industry seminar

Summary:

Combeda Constructions will host a catered seminar event for a minimum of 35 participants from the construction industry. The seminar is designed to provide construction industry duty holders with:

- an avenue for Combeda to share their real life story and lessons learnt in relation to the incident with industry, including the legal and personal impact.
- an opportunity to educate industry on the impact serious workplace incidents can have on families.
- an opportunity to educate industry about their WHS obligations to help to strengthen the level of WHS compliance (see details below).

Combeda Constructions' Director will MC the event and provide a presentation about the incident, the failures that Combeda Constructions was charged with in relation to the incident and the lessons that attendees can take away from Combeda Constructions' experience. Part of this presentation will also cover some takeaways from the investigation and interactions with SafeWork NSW to educate other duty holders in the construction industry about the process from the perspective of a colleague.

The seminar will also include content regarding the safety of young, inexperienced workers in the construction industry and lessons from the incident managing risks to those workers in particular. The seminar will also include a keynote address from the **seminar** to assist with education from the perspective of the family members of young persons who have been killed on construction sites.

Combeda Constructions will make arrangements to have counsellors on site to provide assistance to any attendees arising from any confronting and/or distressing subject matter covered during the seminar.

The seminar will also include a legal briefing component, delivered by **Sector 1** at Combeda Constructions' expense, to educate attendees regarding the general obligations owed under work health and safety legislation. The content of the legal briefing will be tailored to include content that is relevant to the attendees that will attend. WHS obligations covered will include the primary duty of a PCBU, the duties of officers and workers as individuals, duties of principal contractors, and the obligations to notify an incident and preserve an incident scene, as well as consequences for breaches of these duties.

To assist in supporting the distribution of safety resources to industry, Combeda will ensure that copies of the SafeWork NSW Construction Pocket Guide are available at the seminar and distributed to all attendees (in either a print or digital copy). SafeWork NSW will be invited to attend and contribute to the seminar at a time closer to the event. Combeda will look to publish details regarding the event through industry associations to enable a broader number of persons to attend the seminar.

WHS outcome and beneficiaries:

The goal of this strategy is to educate others in the construction industry regarding what they should be doing in their own workplaces and their work health and safety obligations. The legal briefing component will benefit participants from the industry by improving their

understanding of their legal obligations regarding work health and safety. An evaluation will be provided to participants following the seminar, to confirm whether their understanding regarding WHS obligations has increased.

Annexure 1 – Public Notice of SafeWork NSW's acceptance of undertaking

Notice of Acceptance of an Enforceable Undertaking under Part 11 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011.

On 1 February 2021, at a construction site located at Shellharbour NSW, an apprentice who was tasked with installing Dincell formwork wall panels on level 2 of the construction site, stepped onto a piece of plywood. The plywood was covering a penetration. The apprentice fell through the penetration to the basement floor, approximately 12 metres below.

SafeWork NSW investigated the incident and subsequently alleged that Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd contravened section 32 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 (**WHS Act**) by failing to comply with a health and safety duty under s19(1) of the WHS Act.

SafeWork NSW has accepted an enforceable undertaking from Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd, ACN 101 148 529 in accordance with Part 11 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 in relation to the abovementioned alleged contravention. This notice has been placed under the terms of the Enforceable Undertaking and acknowledges acceptance of the Enforceable Undertaking by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd.

The undertaking requires the following actions:

- WHS knowledge and capability building including:
 - the appointment of a Contract Administrator/WHS Compliance Officer.
 - o due diligence training.
 - a third-party audit of WHS operations.
 - digitising WHS compliance systems.
- Host an Industry Seminar that includes:
 - o a lessons learnt presentation by Combeda Constructions Pty Ltd to industry attendees.
 - o a presentation on the impact serious workplace incidents can have on families.
 - a presentation on work health and safety obligations for duty holders.
- Produce and promote a lessons learnt webinar in partnership with SafeWork NSW.
